One was an older gentleman who would pick up an item, consider what seemed to be the price and then return it to the shelf. Another was a daddy with 3 young girls who reminded them that whatever was chosen as a treat would need to be shared. He was willing to get a treat, but they would have to agree. While I consider this good parenting, it was also apparent it might not have been the norm for that family.

A day later we had a discussion at our senior center as some picked up the meal from Bia for the week. This delivery often provided 2 or 3 meals for many who ordered, and one of the men shared that since his wife died, he really struggles with meals and admitted that he does not cook...nor learned to. There are many who grew up in an era where this was common. Providing meals is often the draw

for seniors who downsize and move into senior housing. I am hoping that our community can be proactively supportive of Food Insecurity.
