

## **Lake Mills Area School District Celebrates Referendum Success**

LAKE MILLS, Wisconsin – November 7, 2018

The Lake Mills Area School District is pleased to announce that both questions on the November 6 ballot passed. The vote count for question one was 3147 in favor and 1766 opposed. The vote count for question two was 2504 in favor and 2396 opposed.

“We are grateful to the community for their ongoing support of our schools,” said Dr. Rick Mason, LMASD School Board President. “It’s exciting to see the growth in our community and the opportunities ahead for Lake Mills students!”

### **Planning for Growth**

In August, the Lake Mills Area School District board unanimously approved a resolution to move forward with a November 6, 2018 Referendum. The two questions on the ballot were for \$6.9 million for academic additions and \$2.49 million for a new outdoor multipurpose facility at Lake Mills High School.

These changes will help alleviate classroom overcrowding at the high school, expand and improve hands-on instructional spaces for students, and create a safe, multi-purpose outdoor facility for the District.

Design work will begin immediately this November and projects will be competitively bid next spring. Construction work on the classrooms and multi-purpose field will begin in June 2019 and occupancy is anticipated to be in January 2020.
